1. MISSION

Transformed from the School of English in 2012, the Faculty of English is the only such faculty in Poland and the largest centre of English studies in continental Europe. The research of members of the Faculty covers language, literature and culture of English-speaking countries of the past and present as well as historical, theoretical and applied linguistics. Our scholars and experts have authored an impressive number of books and published numerous articles in the most prestigious linguistic and literary periodicals. The cooperation of our Faculty with universities and research centres in Poland and abroad has always been part of the global exchange of scholarly results and reflection, due to its external contacts, joint projects, conferences, and the mobility of its students and scholars. On the other hand, cooperation with non-academic institutions and organisations in Poznań and outside is a natural consequence of the practical applicability of research and teaching projects conducted in the Faculty of English. The English studies in Poznań are of a varied and interdisciplinary nature, which has led to the development of new teaching programmes and to the extension of the scope of research into such areas as Dutch, South African and Celtic studies.
